Welcome back to campus! As your President, I would like to take the opportunity to briefly update you on progress as we begin our Fall 2019 term and in our 47th year. We welcomed over 400 new students with a wide range of orientation and team building activities to our Richmond and Kensington campuses.

The new leaders of the Student Government and our Residential Advisors and Directors have an important role as ambassadors of the University and part of the support structure and resource for fellow students.

Richmond remains one of the smallest universities in the UK with nearly 1,000 degree students in 2019-2020 (90% of whom are undergraduates); the small class sizes, peer mentorship, and faculty advisors create a unique educational experience. We also position ourselves as an American university focused on the liberal arts and business education and are the only UK institution to award both a US and UK accredited degree.

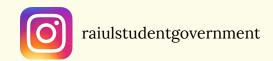
The student physical environment is important to the learning experience and overall satisfaction. We are working together with the University Estates team and Sodexo on a multi-year facilities improvement project and have a strong commitment to Health + Safety. Here are some important steps we have taken in the last year:

- Richmond reception area and hallway renovation (including electronic screen for updates and a receptionist to welcome visitors)
- A new Business School at 37 High Street Kensington with renovated classrooms+ Library in Richmond space modifications opened 24/7 for student study
- Expanded outdoor seating areas for Richmond campus
- Upgrades to the IT infrastructure including addition of new fibre optic line to speed access
- Renovation of the upper dining hall (funded by Sodexo)
- Renovation of the reception area of Asa Briggs (funded by AIFS)
- Renovation of Longley and Lower
 - Cottage and ongoing renovation to Red House to be completed the end of the year (funded by AIFS)
- Night patrols on both campuses to improve the safety and security of our environment
- Improvements to some of our student accommodation spaces (residential rooms and bathrooms in process)We will continue over the summer period to continue renovations and appreciate your patience during this process.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve the Richmond University community as your President and look forward to seeing you soon!

DID YOU KNOW?

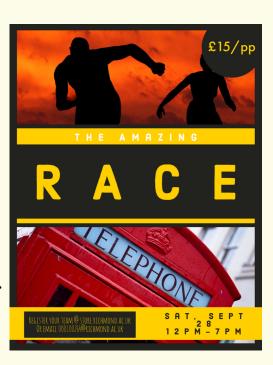
Prayer Room
